

Emergency Procedures Policy

Introduction

Emergencies are never wanted, but they are a possibility and this procedural note familiarises committee members working in Crick Woodlands with the appropriate emergency contacts and procedures.

Minor Injuries

In the case of minor injuries such as cuts, there are first aid boxes in the equipment container in the Jubilee Wood and Millennium Wood.

Major Injuries

The injured person should be made comfortable and the most appropriate course of medical action determined. For a list of contacts see the Appendix.

If an ambulance is called ensure the height bar is not in place over the Sports Field entrance. The bar code is 1970.

Work in the vicinity should cease for the duration of the injured persons presence.

Afterwards

A nominated Committee Member should complete the Accident Report Log in the First Aid box. Record the names and addresses of witnesses or people involved.

Do not discuss legal liability.

At the appropriate time the Crick Woodland Committee should review the accident and consider any outcomes, inform Crick Parish Council (as land owner) together with any additional information or agreed actions.

Crick Woodland Committee

Individual members of the Crick Woodland Committee have a responsibility to be familiar with and to act in accordance with this Procedure

An up to date version of appendix A1 will be displayed on the public notice board at the equipment container in the Jubilee Wood.

APPENDIX – FACILITIES AND LOCATION DETAILS

A1 Local medical facilities

In the case of severe emergency the **Ambulance Service** should be contacted immediately on **999**.

The nearest **defibrillator** is at the **Sports Field Pavilion**. The next ones are at Towers Funeral Services, Church Street and on the wall outside the Co-op on the corner of Main Road and High Street.

The **nearest 24/7 Urgent Care service** is at Rugby St Cross Hospital, approximately 8 miles from Crick Woodlands (CW).

Patients over the age of 5 years with minor injuries and illnesses can attend the Urgent Care Centre where trained nursing staff will undertake an assessment and give advice and treatment. Patients are able to have x-rays, blood tests and a pharmacy is available at St Cross.

The nearest **A&E** is located at Northampton General Hospital, approximately 23 miles from CW. They deal with acute injury or illness (less than 48hrs old), which may or may not be life threatening.

A2 Location

Jubilee Wood

OS Grid reference: SP 593733 - "Turn off Yelvertoft Road in Crick (off the A428, following Church Road towards Yelvertoft). Entrance sign-posted 'Crick Sports Field'. On entering proceed straight forward through car park keeping to left hand side and proceed onto unmetalled track which leads to car park next to wood entrance."

Millennium Wood

OS Grid reference: SP 598732 – "Turn off West Haddon Road (A428) at the Garden Centre , do not go into the Garden Centre but take the right most track (private entrance). After one field there is an entrance with two gates on the left. One is marked 'Emergency Exit Only Millennium Wood'."
